John R Burns November 23, 1931-June 6, 2011

It is with heavy heart that I pass this information along to the membership of Saltfork. Founding member and long time friend ,John Burns, has passed away this month after fighting many serious health problems the past few years. John graduated from Kiowa High School and Northwestern State College with a BA degree in Art. He served in the United States Navy from 1951-54 and married his wife, Ruth, on September 5, 1953.


John Burns was one of the original 13 founding members of Saltfork and remained an active member in the club until his health started to decline in just the last few years. He was also a member of the Gem and Mineral Society based in Enid. Most artist work with only one or two mediums. John was one of those rare artisans that could work in any medium that was set before him. During his life time he created stunning pieces of artwork in jewelry, stained glass, lamps, paintings, etchings, sculptures miniatures, decorative eggs as well as his many forges pieces. His talents also included square dancing with his wife Edith. He was both a caller and performer.

We have lost one of our best members and teachers. He attended many of our conferences and meeting and was always ready to teach a work shop or class. I had the privilege of spending a long weekend with John and Edith at their home near Carmen, Okla. John had agreed to teach me some silver smithing. He was more than generous with his knowledge and use of his equipment and supplies as I did my best to glean as much knowledge from him as I could in the short time I had. I wish I had been fortunate enough to have lived close enough to have been able to have more frequent lessons. John remembered the club in his will. Leaving the club his blacksmithing equipment.

Per John's wishes, his body was cremated and spread,



along with the remains of Ruth, (who preceded him in death), on the farm that he loved so much .






Chisholm trail Festival Living history event and Crawfish Festival


June 4th and 5th, Yukon held its annual Chisholm Trail Festival living history event and Crawfish Festival on the ground of the old Kirkpatrick farm. Jim Carothers, new member, Chuck Ogden and Tony Cable were blacksmithing at the event all weekend. The event offered a very historic setting with mountain men, cowboys and troops with cannons representing north and south. There was even a representative of the camel corps from Texas with two mounts. There were several crafters and artisans at the event as well. Each day was punctuated by cannon fire and gunfights in the old west town street. The shade trees we were set up in made welcome shade and helped cool the breeze. I picked a spot where no grass would grow because I figured it would be shady all day. We made all kinds of blacksmith goods and talked to many people who were interested in what we were doing. There were lots of people eating crawfish and enjoying the other activities too. I enjoyed meeting Chuck Ogden who is a new smith who has had a burning desire for some time but just jumped into blacksmithing. He is doing excellent work for a new smith and is eager to learn. He wants to build a civil war traveling forge on a carriage with a support limber. The limber is a 2 wheel carriage that would hold the extra steel, coal and tools for the forge. This type of forge would have been assigned to the artillery pieces as necessary support for the cannons and their carriages for parts and repairs. There are very few examples left and even fewer working examples of them around today. I would encourage you to come and visit next year or even better, come and blacksmith and be a part. 

Railroad Spike Tomahawk by Tom Moore

The following simple steps yield a tomahawk from a standard railroad spike. The head of the spike is not altered so that the original material is easily identifiable.

The dimensions given are approximate. The biggest problem is holding the thing while performing the operations.

1. Start with a new or unworn spike, 5/8" square and 6-1/2" long.

2. Upset spike on anvil to about 1" square and about 4-3/8" long, keep head cold.

3. Flair upset end with cross peen. Periodically straighten back, smooth blade.

4. Slit eye - swell slit with drift. Straighten any deformities.

5. Grind profile, file smooth and sharpen. Harden in water and temper to a blue.
