From the President.....



I set up my portable forge on Thursday afternoon in preparation for crowds that were expected on Friday and Saturday for the event. There were several activities associated with this year's Western Spirit Celebration. Many Oklahoma wineries were in attendance and hosted a well-attended wine tasting on Friday and Saturday. This event, the "Winin' on the Chisholm Trail" is associated with the local AMBUCS chapter and the proceeds go to their AMTRYKE Program.

Friday was "Senior Citizen Day" but there was a large group of people of all ages there, many of them participating in the various activities going on all day. Saltfork member Mark Galloway was there on Friday to demo for the crowd, too.



Lucian Avery

Lucian Avery started blacksmithing in 1992, captivated by the idea making his own tools for gardening, woodworking and, once he got started, for blacksmithing. Since then, he has forged a wide array of custom pieces, working with designers, builders and homeowners from across the country. His work has ranged from thumb latches for historic buildings to stair railings, fire tools, and garden gates. Lately he has come to especially enjoy making early American door hardware.

In his demonstration Lucian will show how to make thumb latches and strap hinges as well as some tools for smithing and other labors. As he works, he will discuss the details of why steel moves the way it does and how he coaxes it to go where he wants it. His website is www.lucianaveryblacksmith.com

Robert Patrick

I'm 64, have smithed professionally since 1967. I started at a restoration, Hale Farm and Village, in Bath Ohio. In 1970 I attended Midwest Ferrier School in Xenia Ohio and started horseshoeing in addition to blacksmithing. In 1971 I started teaching blacksmithing at Kent State University in the Art Department under Mary Ann Scherr, where I was exposed to art smithing. In 1974 I joined ABANA. In 1976 I moved to the Ozarks and started blacksmithing under Big Anvil Forge with Gerald Brostek. In 1978 I moved to Bethel Missouri and continued under that business name and started Big Anvil Forge School of Blacksmithing. I demonstrated under the Arch in St. Louis for the Frontier Folklife Festivals in the late 1970's early 1980's. I was Master Blacksmith 3 times under the Missouri Arts Council and Once in Arkansas under the Arkansas Craft School. I demonstrated in 1994 and 2000 at ABANA Conferences and taught a forge welding class at the 1998 ABANA Conference, demonstrated with Tom Clark's sculpture group at the ABANA Conference in Richmond, KY, demonstrated at the Caniron Conference in Saskatchewan, Canada, 2001, have demonstrated and taught workshops all over the USA and taught at the Ozark School of Blacksmithing for years, taught at John C. Campbell Folk school, and teach at my own shop by private arrangement. My work encompasses both traditional, and art smithing, ranges from small items to architectural work. I live outside Everton, Arkansas with my wife, Mary, a fiber and glass artist, in the Arkansas Ozark Mountains. Check out the ahilltopforge.com.

Conference family classes....

Community Service Project

At the conference this year, Carol Doner will have fabric and sewing machines available to make Christmas Stockings and a few other projects that are for the men and women who serve our country. The stockings are given to a group that gathers goods and fills the stockings to send to our deployed men and women. She will also have fabric and the pattern for quilts for fallen soldiers' mothers. These are quilts that are made by groups of women and signed, thanking the mother for the protection their child allowed our country. You can stop by and sew for an hour or all day on either project– its for a good cause and we will have lots of fun! If you have any questions send her an email to caroldoner@hotmail.com

Silver clay charms, this class is using PMC which is precious metal clay containing pure silver. We will form our charms using stamps and cookie cutter type shapes, they will be dried and then fired using either a torch or a small propane kiln. This class usually takes about 1 1/2 to 2 hours depending on how quickly you follow directions. You will be able to purchase a bracelet to place your charms on or you can make one larger pendants and purchase a necklace chain.

Fold forming is using copper sheet to form elements that can be incorporated into jewelry such as necklaces or earrings. This has been a very popular class at the monthly meeting and Teresa was asked to do it again at the conference. This technique can be used for silver or even steel with application of heat.

Wire wrapping. You will be taking small gauge silver wire and creating beautiful jewelry using cabochon.

Rose Cross. You will be cutting cross of copper or bronze sheet and then making a rose from copper or bronze (to have contrast). This will take most of Sunday to complete.

Beginning Crochet, you will be taught the basic stitches and make a simple project. You can bring your own hook and yarn if you have some. Kits will be available.

The Oklahoma Lace Guild will be on hand again this year showing examples of bobbin lace. They will also be teaching a simple bobbin lace project.


Basket weaving class. Mary Patrick will be coming to teach her style of basket weaving. She worked from a kit that includes a reed handle but you can pre-register and Bob Patrick will forge up a nice handle for you. There is a \$50. cost for the forged handle. This class will take most of Saturday and part of Sunday depending on how fast you catch on.

Please Pre-Register for any of these classes that have a cost involved in them. The Teachers need to know how many to plan for and some of them if there is not at least 4 pre-registered by Wednesday before the conference they may not make. Registration at the conference is allowed but classes that have not met the registration requirements may have been canceled.


Map to SCABA conference. Fair grounds at 1 Ivanhoe Perry, Okla.

Layering it on ...

SCABA member and jewelry artist Teresa Gabrish is working up a new class for those interested in learning different techniques and metals to make “one of a kind “ pieces of jewelry. You have seen her crosses and hearts now she is adding layers of other metals to give them more depth.

Students will have a choice of either a cross or heart design. Using copper, brass and nickel to create a 3-D layered look to the piece.

The cost of the class will be \$45.00. fee covers cost of instructions and metals.

The date and location is still being arranged, but the tentative date will be in November and it will be held in the OKC area.

You will be asked to bring basic tools like pliers, side cutters and ball pien hammer if you have them. Also if you have bench pins and jeweler saw frames and blades these should be brought also.

For the class to make she will need no less that 5 students and a maximum of 10.

If you are interested in expanding your skills and learning new techniques, email Teresa and get your name on her list. There will be a \$20.00 deposit for the class in order to secure your spot. This fee goes towards the class cost.




Boot Scraper


1. Cut out your design from 11 gauge material leaving the stem wide enough to curl completely around. Clean up and make any veining designs.
2. Punch hole for tenon.
3. Bend any part of your design that will restrict you getting at the stem.
4. Pre form stem in swage.
5. With the peen of your hammer complete rounding up stem being careful not to close end.
6. With a small hammer work the bottom out flat.
7. Draw out bottom to shape.
8. In swage bend bottom to 90 degrees.
9. Shape design and rivet it to scraper.






