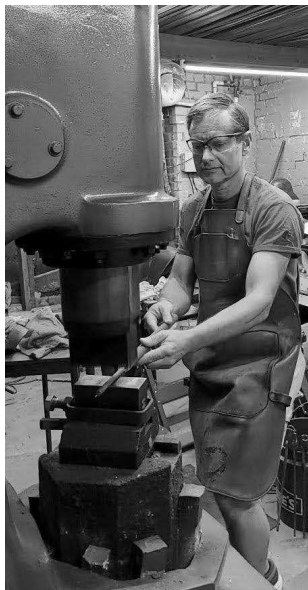

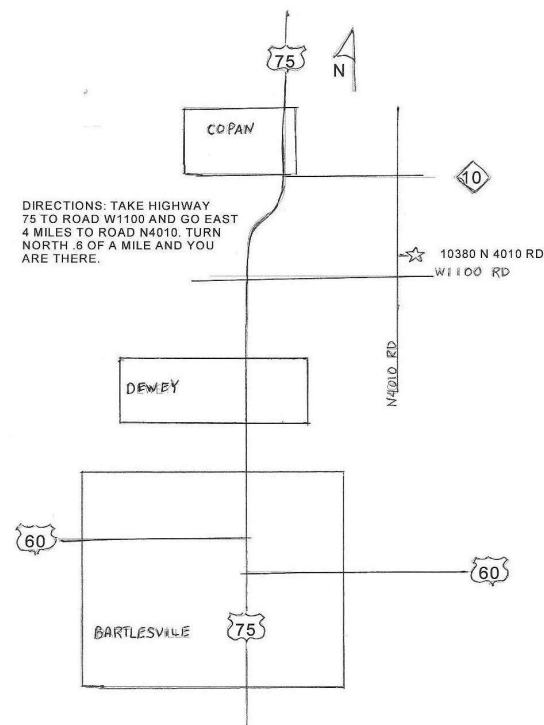

Eulogy for Jimmy Jo (JJ) McGill

JJ was the kind of guy who always “knew a guy” that could fix or do anything you were looking for.

How do you get to the point where you “know a guy”?

It takes a lifetime of being friendly, being a part of the community, and helping others whenever you get the chance. You can’t be a hermit, and you have to associate with people who make things happen. Those who either figure it out or make do with what you have or seek help from someone who does. Someone who sees a need and steps up to help out. Then other folks will start doing the same for you and after a while you will “know a guy”. Put in the effort, the hard work, and the heart work.

It was his idea to host the blacksmith conference here in Sulphur. We were having issues with locations, hotel availability, venues, etc and as it turned out I “knew a guy” who knew a place.

During one auction at our yearly conference I was losing the rhythm of keeping it lively and people entertained. Being the auctioneer and handing out items won was getting a bit hectic. JJ stepped right up and helped out without being asked. He saw the need and stepped right up, you see "he knew a guy" who could help.... It was him.

When it came to hosting blacksmith classes after the conference he was always concerned about "Did you get enough to eat?" Letting you know what was next on the menu so you had something to look forward to.

This earth suit that we wear (said while flexing my hand), was designed and made for us while we are here on earth. If we want to go into space we need a space suit. If we want to go underwater we need a scuba suit. Our bodies were not made to go into those environments alone. Where JJ has gone you cannot take your earth suit. It was not designed for where we are going. Where JJ has gone, he will need a new suit so he had to leave his earth suit behind.

This is not the end by any means. All of JJ's life up to this point has been the "forward" to JJ's book. You know that part up front that tells you about the author? Everything we know about JJ is written in his autobiography in the "forward" section. Turning the page now his book says "Chapter 1" and the adventure continues.

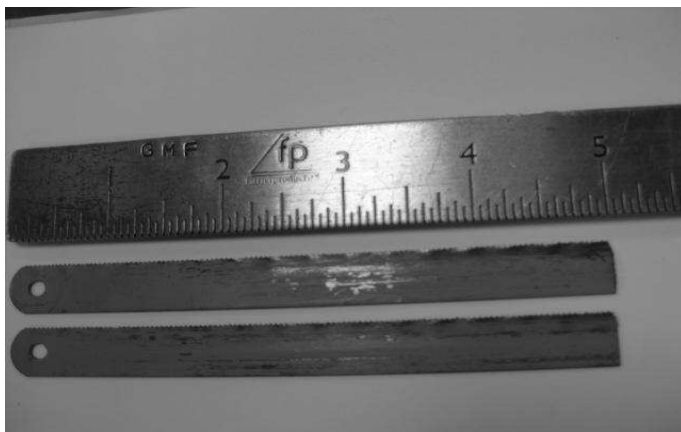






Quickie Divider by Gerald Franklin

Broken hacksaw blade? Don't be too quick to throw it away. Follow the progression to make yourself a quickie divider to help with project layout. Not fancy but it is functional.



Start with equal lengths of the broken blade. Make sure you save the factory holes.



Rivet or bolt the pieces together



Grind each leg to a point and you're ready to put it to work.

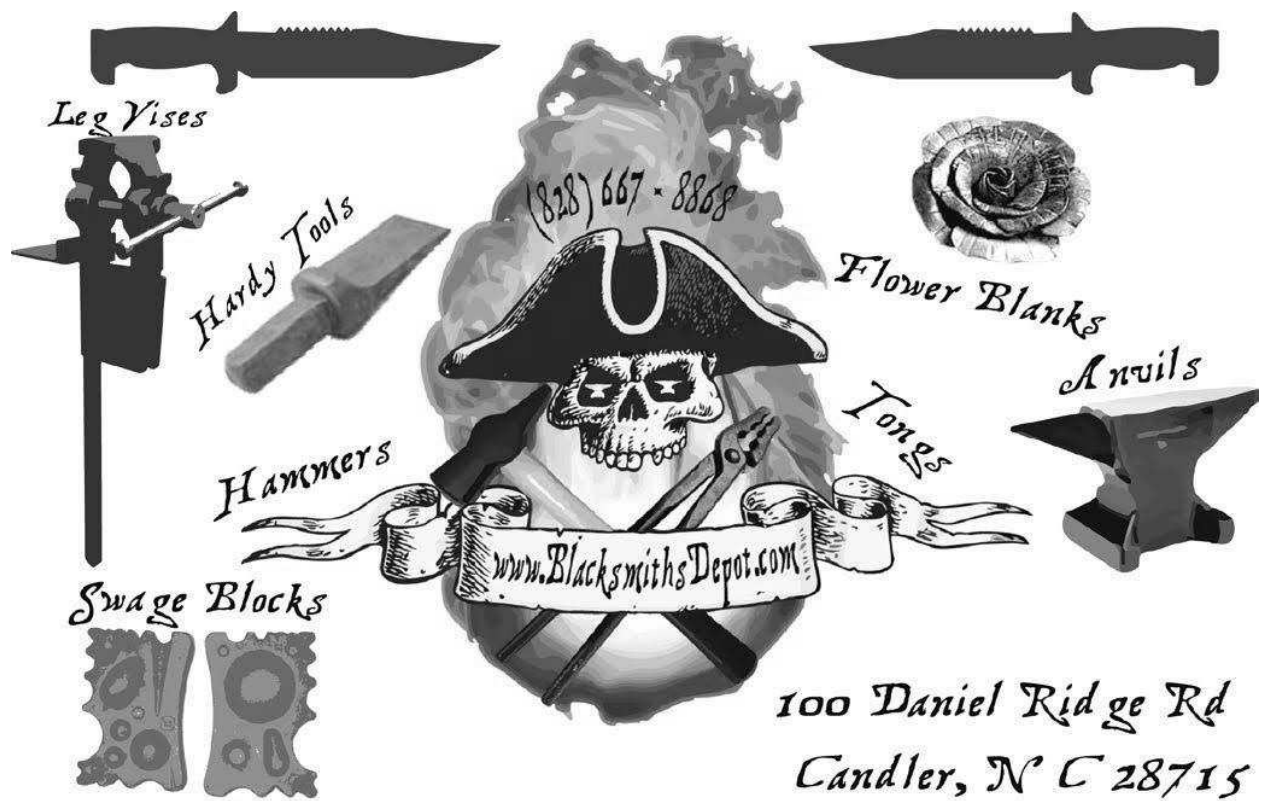

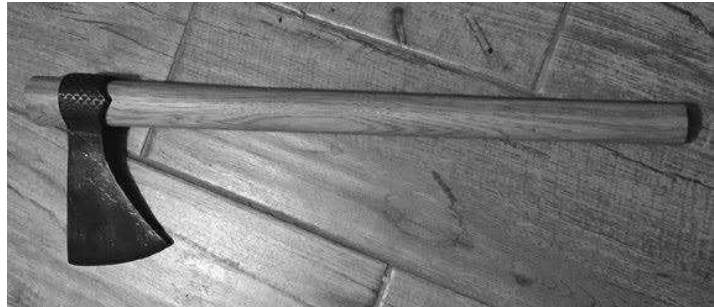

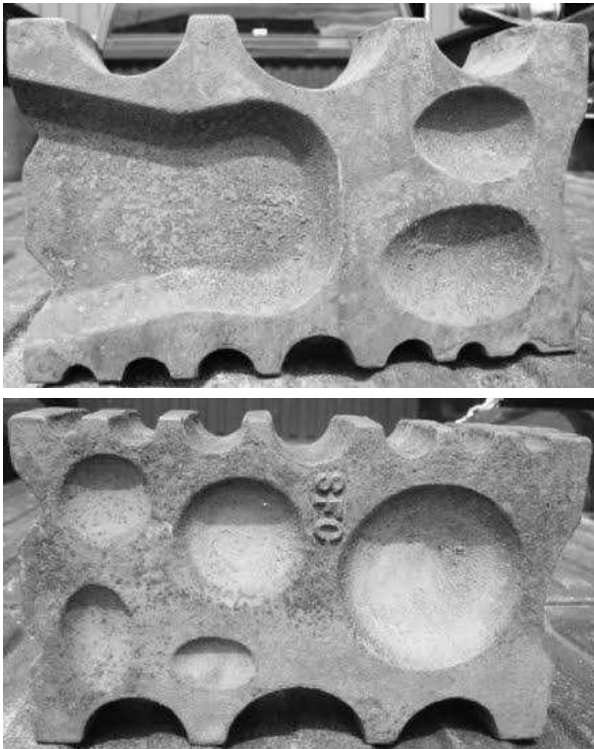
